Soldiers have been brave

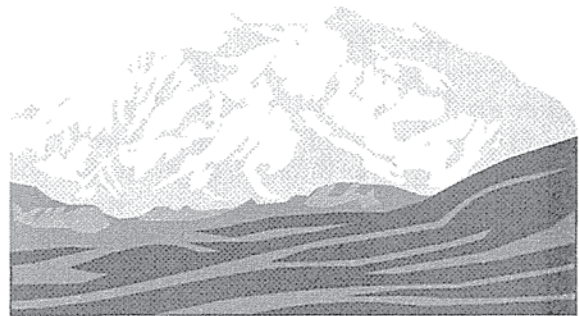

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Academic

Bream Bay College has had another good year academically. Our 2003 results were good. To understand our results you need to know that Bream Bay College is a year 7 to 13, decile 5 secondary school, with a roll of around 500 students.

Year 11 credits obtained 2003: The average number of credits obtained for our year 11 students is 76.9%. The average number obtained for year 11 students in the Whangarei District is 69.9%; for year 7 to 13 schools- 74.5%; for decile five schools- 70.4% and for schools in our roll range 74.7%.

Year 12 credits obtained 2003: The average number of credits obtained for our year 12 students is 79.1%. The average number obtained for year 12 students in the Whangarei District is 70.3%; for year 7 to 13 schools- 72.4%; for decile five schools- 69.3% and for schools in our roll range 73.8%.

2003 Candidates gaining an A Bursary: The average number obtaining an A Bursary for our year 13 students is 19.2%. The average number for year 13 students in the Whangarei District is 11.0%; for year 7 to 13 schools- 18.5%; for decile five schools- 13.6% and for schools in our roll range 11.7%.

Students leaving with no formal attainment (less than 14 credits): The number for Bream Bay College is 5.6%, for the Whangarei District 15.3%; for decile 5 schools- 15.6% and for our roll range- 13.0%. We are particularly pleased with this result as it has tracked down consistently over the last few years. Bream Bay College 2000 was 21.8%, 2001 was 27.7% and 2002 was 18.6%.

We are pleased to see these results but we are still looking to improve them further. I am convinced that we can achieve 100% of our students obtaining a grade of Achieved or above in their assessments. Achieved is recall-some simple rote learning and you are there. Merit is recall with understanding while Excellence is knowing it all and being able to apply it with flair. The only reason why a student does not get achieved is that they did not do enough work. Understanding this about our achievement base system is a key to making it work for you.

We have continued our tradition of producing top quality orators by coming first and second in the years 9 and 10 Rotary International Debating contest. Our College speech competition contestants also produced high quality speeches. We continue to achieve highly with students also obtaining distinctions in the Australian Mathematics, English and Science competitions.

One of our Year 10 Enterprise Teams won the top award in the BP Community Enterprise Competition while the other gained an Excellence award. The enterprise classes held a very successful market day.



We continue to be successful in obtaining scholarships for our students and you will hear an impressive line up in the 'special awards.'

2004 saw the introduction of Gateway to our school. We had forty two students on Gateway placements. We expect to increase this number in 2005. Early on in the year we had a number of students leave school to jobs after a Gateway placement. We began to worry about the effect of Gateway but the overall result is students staying longer to achieve qualifications so that they can enter their preferred career.

Staff have continued with professional development in the fields of literacy and gifted and talented education (GATE). We are well set to meet the new national priority of catering for gifted and talented students. The focus of the professional development has been on catering for individual needs through differentiated teaching.

All permanent teaching staff were provided with laptops for 2004. We are now seeing a higher level of ICT skills in our staff with a flow on effect to students. We look forward to further enhancing the College's ICT capabilities in 2005. We will move from our satellite internet connection to School-Zone. This will give us faster access and better control of what comes and goes from our site. We have recently introduced printer tracking software. When a student pays their school fees we will load their network account with \$10 worth of printing. Students will be able to purchase vouchers like pre-pay phone vouchers from the office to recharge their accounts. We have upgraded our photocopiers to enable this to happen and now have a 1200 dpi colour copier on site that will print A3 or A4 photos for students at \$1 each.

We have completed the ground work and are ready to introduce a Graduation Diploma at years 8 and 10 in 2005. Students who do not graduate will be expected to stay at their current year level. We expect this to change the types of discussions in the College from one of "you must work or else" to one of "how can we help you achieve and graduate?"

2004 has seen the usual array of trips and co-curricular activities taking place. New ventures have been a year 9 Social Studies trip to Wellington and a year 9 and 10 Spirit of New Zealand Challenge trip, along with the return of the Shakespeare Lodge camp for the year 7 and 8 students. The end of year Electives Programme has many new possibilities added and looks to be another exciting two days to finish the year.

Marie Smyth has been given four periods per week to search out authentic learning opportunities for each curriculum area in our school. We hope to link a topic in each subject with an industry where the learning taking place is relevant to the industry. We will keep you posted on the progress.

Student Welfare

The student welfare team in the College has gone from strength to strength. The Deans and House Leaders, along with Senior Managers, are looking at individual solutions to problems as they arise. Complex problems require complex solutions and I commend them for their efforts.



We have been lucky to be able to introduce a doctor to the College as part of our health team thanks to a Manaia PHO initiative. Our students are now benefiting from totally free visits to the doctor.

Our team continues to use our Targeted Funding for Educational Achievement with flare. As a result of purchases made from this fund, there is no excuse for any of our students to come to school without gear or be out of uniform.

This year we have trialled the services of a behavioural optometrist. We had hoped that their diagnosis would provide us with reasons for some students' difficulties with learning. The jury is still out on the success of this trial.

Our Special Needs Coordinator has put in place a school wide register that is assisting staff track learning needs.

We have continued with our stance on drugs and have placed a number of students on Rubicon contracts as a result. The Drugs Awareness Week was again a great success this year.

IAS (I am Special) became a new word in our College this year. Fifty of our seniors went to an IAS leadership day and have worked to differing degrees on projects around the College.

We undertook a Truancy Initiative to reduce the number of students absent or missing periods. This will carry on into 2005. We look forward to better academic outcomes as a result of our efforts. Parents a note or a phone call would help us a lot.

Making the transition to a Restorative School has caused some concerns for staff this year. It takes more time and sometimes the process is not fully successful. The old traditional practices of detention based correction easily return. Eleven of our staff were fortunate to have been able to attend a workshop put on by Bill Rogers in the September holidays. His concept of relaxed vigilance, I believe, is the answer to completing restorative practices implementation in our college. It is simple, builds emotional intelligence, is non-confrontational and is highly effective. We will keep you posted.

Sports

Welcome Ms Kidd. Sarah-Jane has added new impetus to our sporting activities. The number of students participating has increased and the number of activities has increased. Access to the lunchtime gear shed is now regular.

Changes include a new sports exchange with Otamatea High School, new uniforms for the different codes and new hockey goals. We are in the process of putting in place a memorandum of understanding with the Bream Bay Swimming Club and have offered our gym as the base for the Waipu Netball club.

Our swimming sports had high levels of participation but our athletics was down a little on last year. We trialled a voluntary cross country system. The event ran smoothly but I would still like to see all students at least walk the course.



Cultural

Te Tuinga concert was again a great success. We have many talented students in our College. The 2004 Stage Challenge group put on a commendable performance showcasing our dramatic and dance talents.

The recent music night had over 90 students perform for an audience of over 250. Our musical talent, including that of our teachers, is the envy of most schools. The big sing group was again the largest group to perform at the competition. Two of our bands made it to the local Rockquest finals with our senior band Gravel being selected to try out for the national competition. Cass Mitchell took out the Most Outstanding Female Musician award. I look forward to next year's bands filling the large gap that is being left by her departure. The pipe band is also taking shape and growing.

The Kapahaka Roopu continues to perform at the top level and is often invited to be part of the official proceedings at formal events.

Unfortunately the planned drama production this year did not get off the ground. In 2005 we hope to follow on from the recent successful primary schools' drama performances with a year 7 and 8 drama night. We are also planning to add a night of speeches to our 2005 calendar where parents can be the audience for our speech finalists.

Leadership

We started the year with a very successful year 13 leadership camp at the Tangihuas. We had a large number of prefects announced immediately after this camp. This caused some discussion about consistency in the selection criteria and, as a result, the prefect application criteria and processes have been altered to ensure that all available information is collected. Ideally, all senior students would qualify to be prefects because they help around the college, being good role models and exercising control in a positive manner.

M-People - our senior mediators were set up and have assisted with disputes between students during the year. A group of year 7 and 8 students were trained to be Cool School Mediators and during term 4 a group of year 8 and 9 students were trained to be Peacekeepers for 2005.

2005 will see the introduction of a graduated student council system. We will have a year 7 and 8 council, a year 9 and 10 council and a senior council. The junior councils will receive their funding from a mufti day and social that they will organise. They will also have representatives on the senior council. Added to this, we will have class leaders rotating through the students at year 7 and 8.

Staffing

We have continued to have a relatively stable staff. Mrs Hutton left us on maternity leave at the start of this year. She has since taken up a position at Rodney College. Mrs Buckland has relieved for her. Mrs Kaye Burgess joined us in Social Studies-Geography, Mr Lynch in English and Miss Gemma Jackson in year 7 and 8. Miss Victoria



Burrows joined us permanently along with Miss Hannah Edge and Mrs Sandra Hayward who took on the position of co-head of year 7 and 8.

We celebrated 25 years of service each for Rose Waerea and Gordon Lee with a function at the fire station. This function will be remembered for many years to come.

Mrs Debi Woodward returned to us in a part time role as our special needs coordinator and has since left us at the start of term four to have a baby. She is relocating to Taupo.

Gateway placements this year have included: Boat Building, Early Childhood Education, Equine (horses), Community Services, Plumbing, Cabinet-Making, Youth Counselling, Hairdressing, Tyre Fitting, Administration, Farming, Plastering, Building, Computer Technician, Reception, Hospitality, Automotive – Panel Beating, Motorcycles and Landscaping.

The Gateway programme involves having a motivated senior student in a workplace regularly (e.g 1 day per week but being VERY flexible to suit the student and employers needs) for around 10 weeks. It is at NO cost to the employer and provides a wealth of experience for the student who undertakes Unit Standards in that industry towards their NCEA school academic achievement. It is also a great opportunity for employers to trial and meet prospective employees.

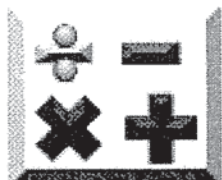
The Year Seven and Eight teachers have done sterling work in introducing the Numeracy Project over the last two years. The Numeracy Project was trialled a few years ago at Whau Valley Primary in Whangarei, and has moved up to the College arena. Bream Bay will continue the project into Year Nine with training, testing and studies to be completed. The early results from the Primary area indicates that the emphasis and change of approach to teaching and the learning of Number work is quite significant and will have long term benefits for all students coming through this project. Mrs R Carman has been the Maths Advisor to Bream Bay, and should also be congratulated for her promotion and fostering of the Project in the Year Seven and Eight Department.

The College was involved in a number of competitions this year from the Otago University one to the Mathex in Whangarei. Stephen Abercrombie, Conner Power, Kallam Brown achieved high grades in the Canterbury University Competition and in one of the two Australian Competitions students entered. The Mathex Competition caters for Year Seven to Ten students, who compete in teams of four against other Northland schools. Four Bream Bay teams were entered, one team each from Year Seven to Ten. It is a real experience to see students answering a series of questions in forty five minutes, and racing around to have their answers checked before moving on to the next one. Well done to all students who partook in all the competitions sat.

The Senior part of the College continues to excell at the NCEA level and equally as well in the NCES part at Year Eleven. Level Three started this year at Year Thirteen and it was pleasing to put into practice what teachers had been trained in, over the past year or so. Year Eleven students were being taught by their teachers in the third year of NCEA being implemented and as time goes by, the courses are gaining in terms of what needs to be covered, the preparation for testing and exams, internally or externally, and the students being able to see where various topic are heading. The path to success is getting better and clearer to all. Equally, Year Twelve in its second year, is gaining in strenght.

Each year this department keeps bursting at the seams with more students realising the importance of becoming computer literate. With technology being an integral part of our lives these days and computers playing a pivotal role in most jobs and careers, it is becoming increasingly essential to have good computer skills.

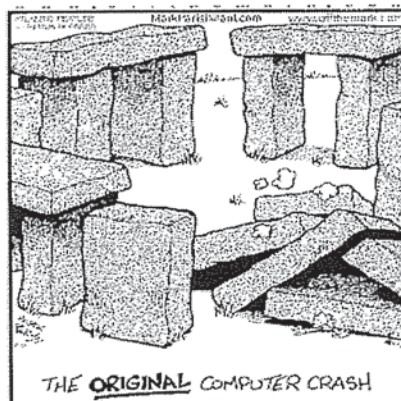
This year we have had 3 senior multi-level classes in ICT with 8 students completing the National Certificate in Business and Computing Level 2. Congratulations to these hard working, dedicated students who will leave school with an excellent qualification and a foundation of great computing skills.

As well as the senior classes our year 10 classes have expanded with 3 classes this year. Our hard working Year 10 classes have covered a full programme preparing them for Year 11 Achievement Standards and Unit Standards in 2005. This interesting course has covered units of work, followed by Internal Assessments. This year the Year 9 option classes have had a 13 week taster course which has mainly concentrated on keyboarding skills and entering text. It is amazing how bad habits on the keyboard can form before Year 9, so learning the keyboard is a very important skill in computing.

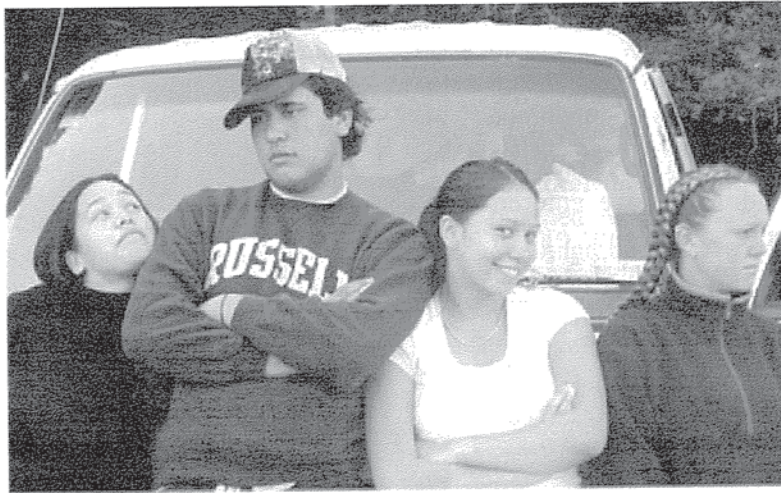
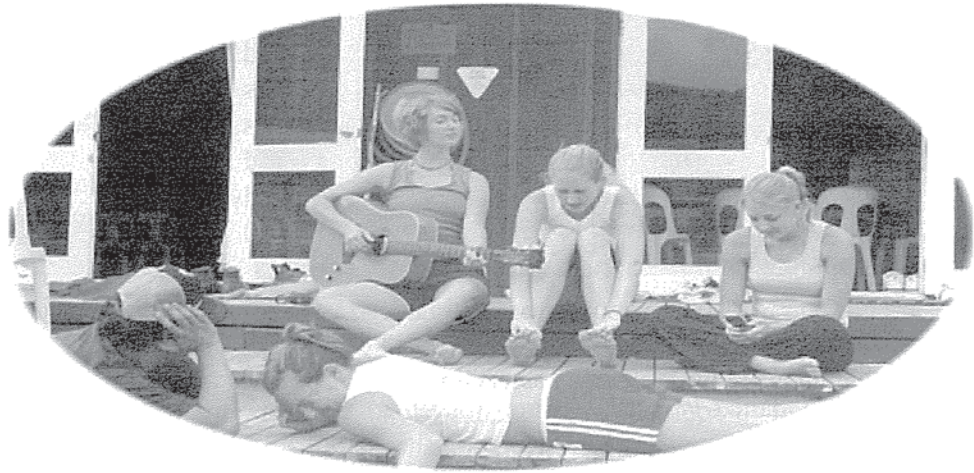
The highlight of 2004 was getting 25 brand new computers. After many years our dinosaurs have been put out to pasture. This has meant we have computers that work and rarely break down! Another streamlining this year has been putting Mavis Beacon Typing Tutor software onto the computers, as well as an interactive course with modules for the senior classes on Electric Paper. This has not only improved students keyboarding skills but has offered an alternative to working only from texts.

Next year we are introducing NCEA Achievement Standards in Information Management at Year 11 and will continue into Yrs 12/13 Technology (ICT), as well as the multi-level Unit Standards in Computing and Business and Computing Level 2/3. This will mean that students will have the opportunity and choice to gain Achievement with Merit and Excellence. 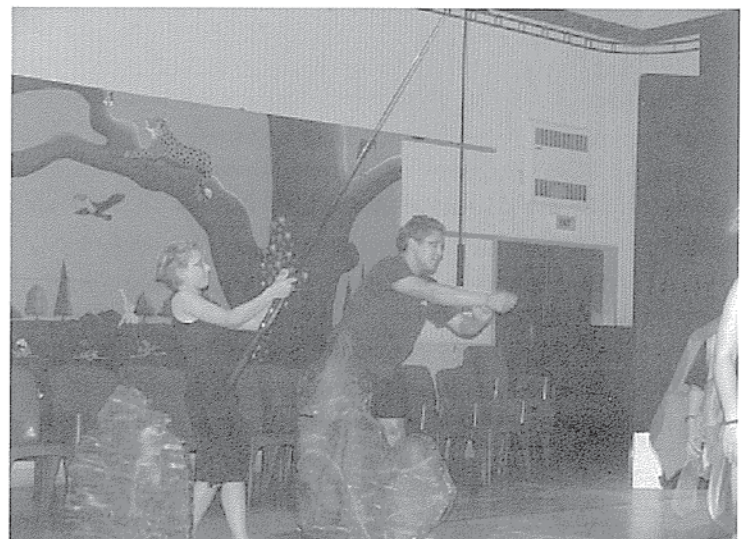
Next year sees the introduction of Level 2 NCEA dance, which will be a new challenge. It is great to see dance is going from strength to strength. We have many talented students in the school.

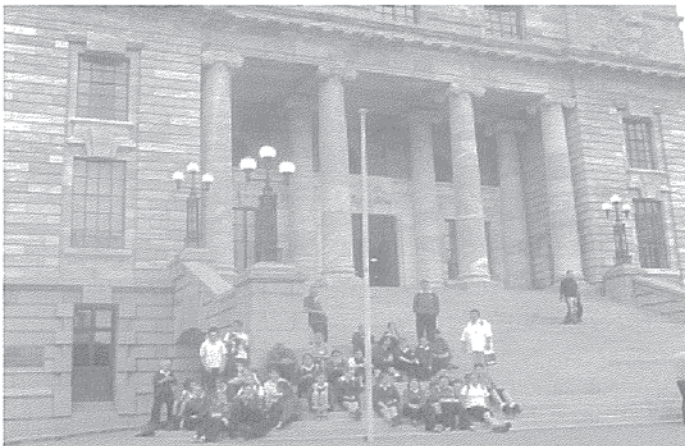
Tuesday 9th November

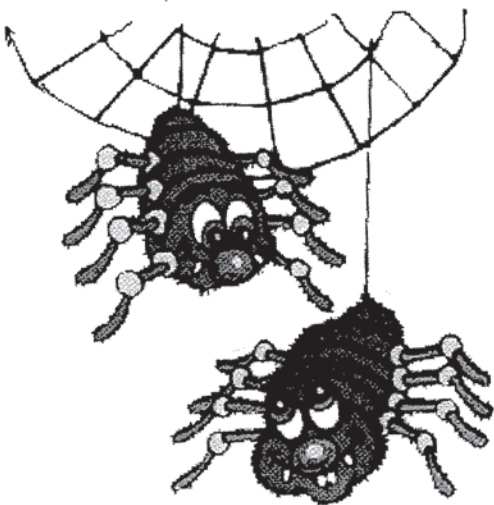

It took many months to replace the stolen gear and lots of extra work.

Guitar teacher Toby Burt left us in February to continue his interest in sound recording. We were lucky to have had Toby's assistance over these past three years. His humour and quiet manner with students along with his readiness to assist and promote our musicians was much appreciated.

We were fortunate to find another local with the necessary range of skills to cover this course. Mark Gordon joined us and has shown a willingness to work the extra hours necessary for any success with our bands and musicians. Mark also took over teaching the jazz musicians when we needed a replacement there too.

Gina D'Ath was excellent as MC and she also sang 'Knocking on Heavens Door' which allowed guitar tutors Gordon Lee and Mark Gordon to demonstrate their skills, with Jim Lawrie providing excellent backing on drums. Later in the show, Lisa Abbott burst onto the stage and did a 'Tina Turner' knock-out number. Wow! Such talent available to learn from in our school.

This was obvious at the Senior Prizegiving. The senior musicians supplied an appropriate quiet, reflective number overlaid with harmonies, interesting percussion and guitar backing and a senior vocal group sang in three part harmony. Both these groups showed skill, enjoyment and commitment.

Our trip started with a twenty minute boat trip out to the lighthouse, followed by a two night stay, and an eight hour tramp out.

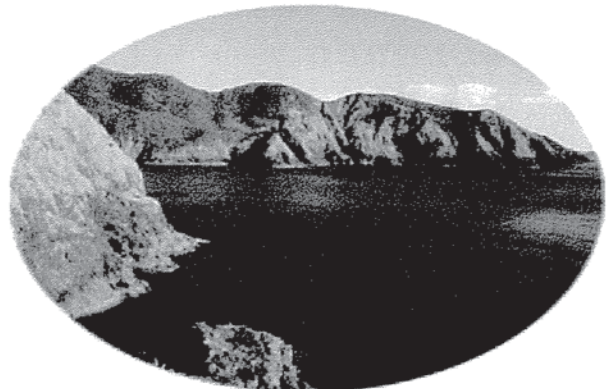

My return to this department following a term of absence (Term 4, 2003) on medical leave due to a road cycling accident was approached with feelings of self doubt and a lack of confidence. I am especially thankful to the major PE staff – Sarah Jane Kidd and Jenny Thornhill for their excellent work in my absence. I am impressed with the energy and enthusiasm of Sarah Jane's teaching and amazed at the speed of achieving confidence in student management by Jenny. Both teachers make remarkable contributions to the physical development of young people. I also wish to thank Tracey Chapman and Gemma Jackson who expanded their homeroom role to include the taking of their class PE programme – quite a substantial challenge.

The department mantra continues to be 'Accentuate the Positive, Eliminate the Negative.' This represents a major challenge to staff as they confront the trends of obesity/inactivity; media glorification of violence in sport; fun versus challenge in skill acquisition and behaviour/language standard decline. NCEA 1 Phys. Ed – The comments for NCEA 3 apply equally for this group. The students have adjusted extremely well to the academic requirements of this subject. This challenge can be overwhelming at times and is assisted by offering a quality course with a low number of credits (11). It will be interesting to see how the 05 class handle the full course!?

NCEA 2 Phys. Ed – The 6th form PE class has had an absolutely fabulous year. The course covered Hauora/fitness, swimming, rock climbing, anatomy and biomechanics, motor developing, psychology skills, leadership and

risk management. The students had an awesome opportunity to go to the Outdoor Pursuit Centre where they went caving, rock climbing, experienced Adventure based learning, stared their biggest fears down and conquered extreme activities as a well oiled team.

The students have worked extremely hard and completed a range of physical activities and skills that can be used in the future in sporting and work arenas. All in all, it has been a memorable year, full of learning, covering all aspects of life. So a huge thanks and well done to the students for making Level 2 a blast. Agent Orange we will miss you and heads up for your next challenge. J.T

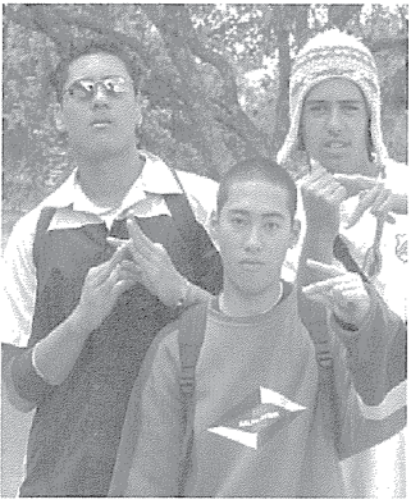
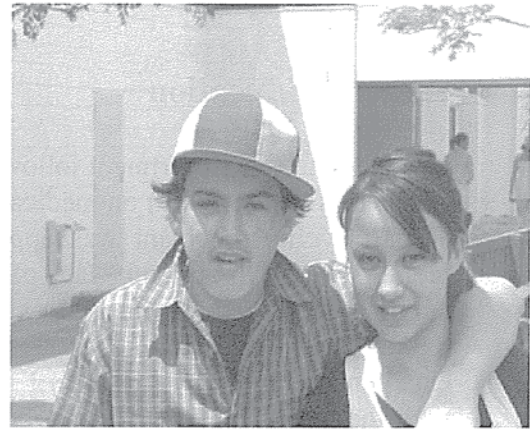

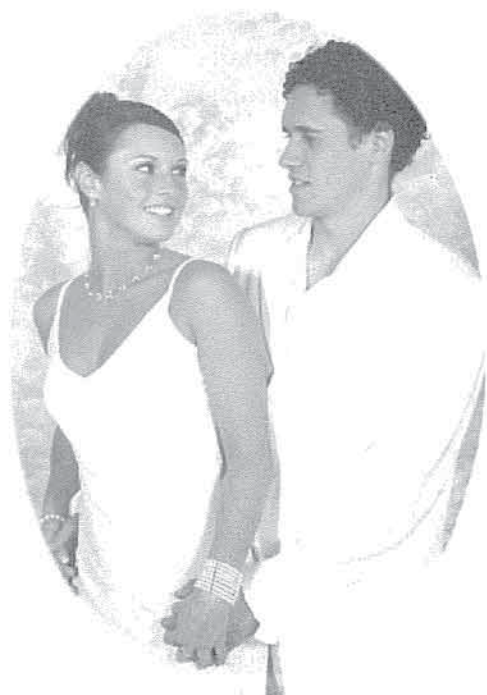

Art Department

Well this year in the art department students and teachers have worked, and worked, and worked some more. As usual our students have produced many fine artworks. Some of these have been exhibited in the auditorium, both for our Te Tuinga concert and also for our prize givings. It is a real pity that senior artwork cannot be displayed until the junior prize giving, but this is because at the time of the senior prize giving art folios are in Wellington being externally assessed by NZQA.

Junior Art

In the Junior department Ms Edge and Ms Mackay have held the for from year seven to year nine with Miss Jackson teaching art to her own class. I have taught year ten students. Many thanks to these teachers who work extremely hard to ensure that students produce a high standard of art work in a variety of media. As well as working with pencil, crayon, dye, charcoal, pastel, paint, gesso and shellac, students spent more time on three dimensional work than last years. Ms Mackay made three-dimensional portraits with year nine using paper pulp and Miss Edge took year seven and eight students to the beach to make sculptures from natural materials, after first making Marquettes at school. Miss Jackson took her class on an exciting trip to the Quarry in Rust Avenue where they learnt how to make their own paper.

Year ten students also made three dimensional pieces as part of their mixed media artwork based on Pacific patterns.

Senior Art

This year NCEA assessments have dominated our senior department , with painting and photography being the two subjects taught at level two and level three. Sculpture was too difficult to timetable this year.

Peter Davies has continued to tutor our level two and level three photography students in Camera and darkroom skills. Peter is a professional photographer as well as a very experienced school teacher. He freely gives us his own time to help students in his weekends, as well as the regular three hours per week for which he is timetabled. We are lucky to have a tutor of his experience and generosity.

This was our first year for NCEA level three and students completed courses in

painting and photography, with one student doing sculpture by correspondence.

Research featured strongly at all NCEA levels and dominated the first term and half the second term. The research component certainly gives students a good understanding of contemporary artworks and the relevant art history behind them. This study also helps students to generate and clarify ideas of their own. Research studies as well as generation and exploration of own ideas are both areas of work that are internally assessed although they are moderated by NZQA. These assessments are followed by a solid of work which is externally assessed by NZQA. What a mammoth!

Ball Decorations

As always year 13 art students made a huge contribution to the school ball decorations committee in designing, collecting, making and putting up decorations. 'Garden of Eden' was the theme and it sure looked great!

Most of us have little idea how hard and how long students work on ball decorations, often weeks before they even appear in the Auditorium to be put up. Well done decorations committee and thank you also to the extra workers who helped put them up.

Uniforms

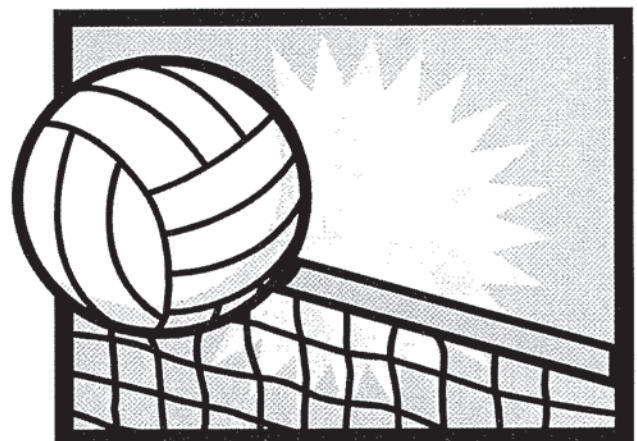

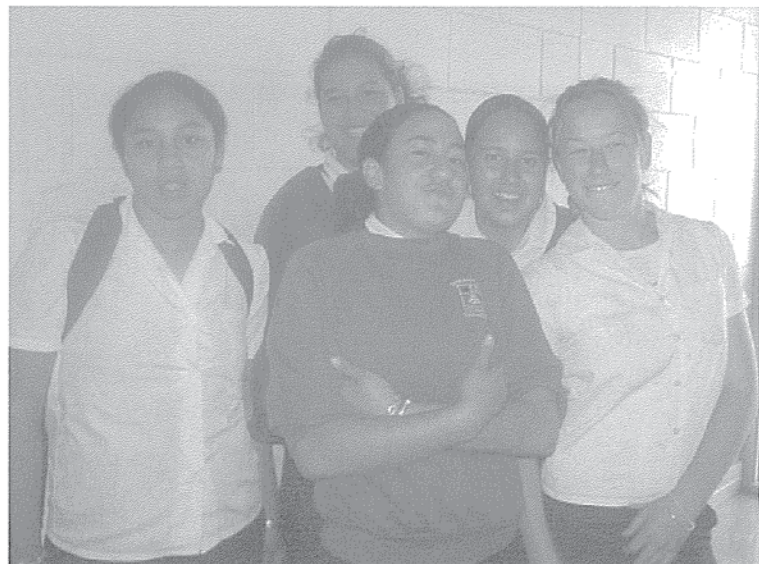
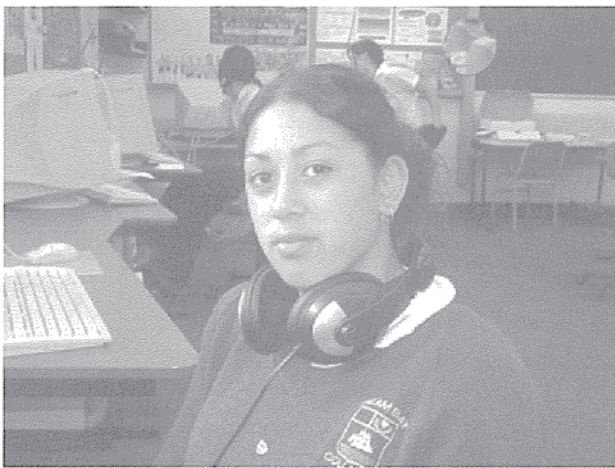
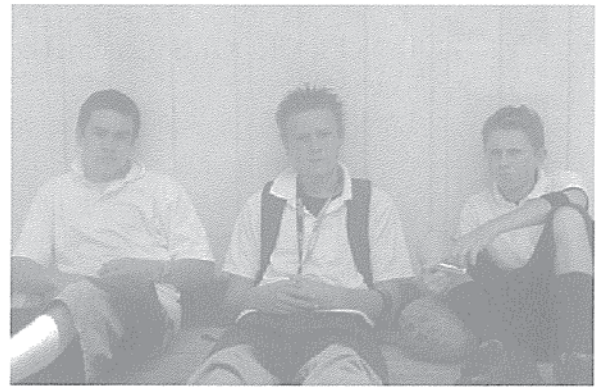
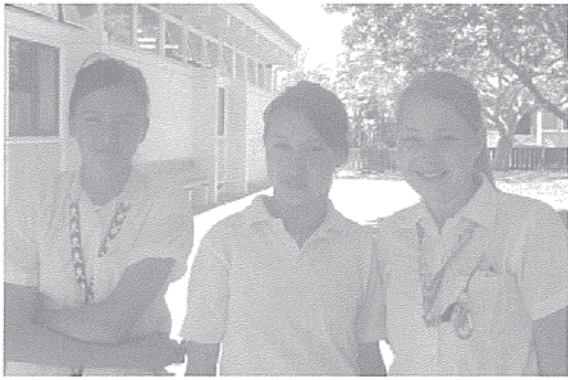
I have only made brief reference to just some of the sporting activities that have occurred in school this year. Next year we are aiming to further increase participation and bring on board and up skill more sport coaches.
