Topic: **Principal's report** NCEA changes NCEA changes have been moved back at least 1 year so we are seriously considering to drop NCEA Level 1 in 2023. So, in 2023 we may go back to a year 12 with 5 subjects with 20 credits and a revamp of the curriculum to a more deep learning model more in line with the new NCEA. Kick off with Heads of Department and make a call in term 1 and look at what the new courses would look like in term 3&4. HJ: At WGHS they don't do year 11 subjects. Dargaville High have dropped year 11 and so have 30% of other schools. Wayne talked to the reasoning behind how we would do this and how much more exciting this could be. HJ: Would the students get quals after year 11? Parents of WGHS girls were concerned that their girls wouldn't get practice. At WGHS there are 220 choices when you get to year 12. It's important to get the right choices. All in design and monitoring and we are above that with PcSchool. Discussion took place. Next year PcSchool drops their support for back office. Move to a package timetable.

Discussion re scholarships - is this happening with Sarah for next year.

Discussions with Jo Mayne re leadership. One of things we could do in year 12 - you can do a lot more interruptions with whole days to make schooling more fun. Frees up more time for fun stuff.

Extending kids at the top would be a good option.

If you are leaving the board, we would be making the changes for 23 while you are still all here.

Rather than leave our innovation for a length of time it's about time to move into a deep learning model.

Review our 9/10/11 package and come up with something exciting.

Look at retention rate from 7-10 – highest it's ever been. If you were losing those numbers from the existing numbers in the college it would be different.

Change in whanau, change in leadership in senior school. Giving other teachers the opportunity to deal with it.

The primary school principals said there is nothing wrong with the college, but we need to market it better.

Sending all seniors out to a job for a job exploration.

Alison to organise seniors to do community service.

HJ: Mark has put in the report that there is sport equipment available to each whanau class.

SG: Pride in the school for a long time. For the first time I heard a staff member say how lucky the kids are to have a great school with green spaces.

4 new heads have a structure within the Councils that has the backing of the 11 & 12s and would expect this to grow and grow.

Getting kids from Waipu to Otamatea is difficult.

Wayne spoke with the HODs and a discussion took place regarding the lack of effort re the Open days. He is needing all HODs to step up and promote the school.
